PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

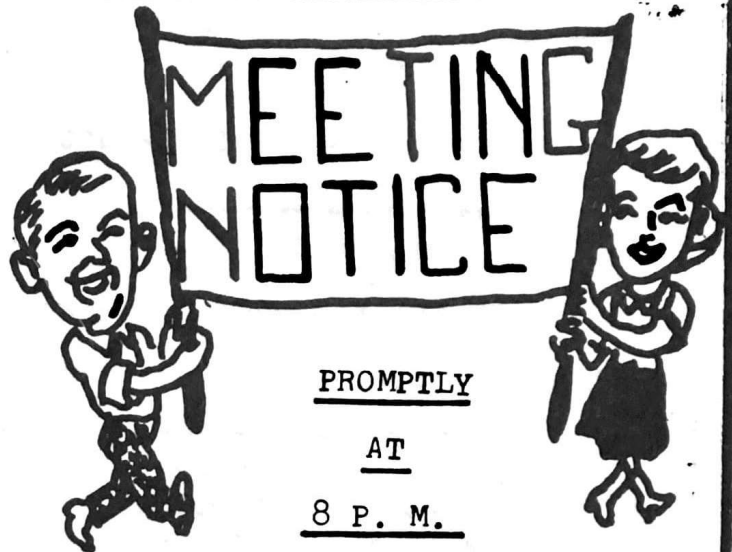
As we start our 10th year, I would like to welcome everybody back from the summer. I hope that the rest will give us renewed vigor in trying to strengthen our community.

TAKE A BITE OUT OF CRIME

How To Protect Your Neighborhood

Be a good neighbor: Want to know the best crime prevention device ever invented? A good neighbor. The police can't be everywhere at once, but you and your neighbors can. You're the ones who really know what's going on in the neighborhood.

Put that neighborhood know-how to work. It's simple: just use your eyes and ears - and then your telephone. If you spot something suspicious, call your police station. Don't try to stop a criminal yourself - it can be dangerous.

Report crime. Sounds easy, doesn't it? But only about half of all crimes are ever reported. Too bad, because police can't do anything if they don't know what happened. They say information from people like you is the key to solving many crimes. Even an anonymous tip is better than no report at all. So, don't hesitate! Follow this rule: if you see something suspicious, call police so that police can act-fast. The longer you wait, the harder it is to catch the criminal.

Start a neighbor watch. It's easy. Get together with neighbors on your block. Exchange home and work telephone numbers and information about daily routines, planned vacations or visitors, scheduled repairs or deliveries. That way, your neighbors know what to look out for. If neighbors spot an unfamiliar car in your driveway or activity in your home while you're away, they know they should call the police.

What to look for....You see a stranger hanging around your area offering candy to children...Your neighbors are on vacation, but there's a window open on the first floor....A stranger in the neighborhood knocks on front doors, then walks around to the back...Someone is running down your street with a stuffed pillow case, a suitcase, a TV or radio...You are awakened late at night by a loud scream and dogs barking...Sometimes the signs of a crime are obvious, sometimes they're not. Trust your EYES, your EARS, and your COMMON SENSE. Anything unusual may point to a crime. Remember... no detail is too trivial!

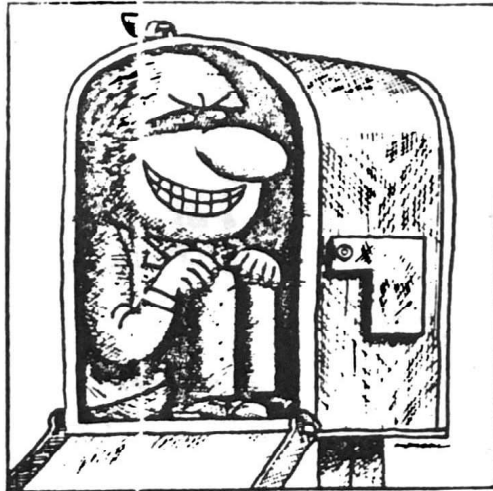

PROTECT YOUR MAIL:

The enclosed material should be used by your group in the Prevention of Mail Thefts. Each of us has an obligation to be a good neighbor. Developing a Tenant Patrol is one step in achieving this goal. Help protect your mail and that of your neighbors. Follow these helpful hints:

- *Have a person or persons at the mailbox area when your mail is scheduled to be delivered.
- *If mailboxes do not have locking devices, someone could be appointed to be responsible for the mail not picked up at the time of delivery, as long as they have the permission of each addressee.
- *Report suspicious people following the mailman or looking into mailboxes after the delivery of mail.
- *Provide a description of the thief to the local Postal Inspector.
- *Insist upon secure mailboxes at your building.
- *Watch the collection box on the street, if one is near your location, possibly as part of the Tenant Patrol. Your mail is stored in that box as well as your neighbors.

SAFETY TIPS

Travel and shop with companions when
ever possible during the daytime as
well as nighttime. There is greater
safety in numbers.

If possible avoid carrying a pocket-

pockets or hidden elsewhere on your

WHAT TO DO

SAFEGUARDS

<p>Grease or broiler fire</p> <p>Burning appliances</p> <p>Clothing or hair catches on fire</p> <p>First-degree burns (surface redness accompanied by soreness and sting)</p> <p>Second-degree burns (blisters with swelling and redness)</p> <p>Third-degree burns (top layers of skin are burned away)</p>	<p>Do not use water, which will only float the burning grease, not extinguish the flames.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If a skillet of food is on fire, turn off range and slip a lid over pan to cut off all oxygen. • If the broiler catches fire, turn off broiler and use potholders to open oven door. Cover flames with wet towel to cut off oxygen and douse with baking soda to smother the fire. <p>If possible, unplug. In any case, do not use water or you risk electric shock. Snuff out flames with a large, dry towel.</p> <p>Do not run or you may feed the flames. Stop, drop to floor and roll.</p> <p>Hold ice against tender burn area with clean cloth. Do not use butter or oil, which causes blistering.</p> <p>Take off any clothing soaked with boiling liquid. Use ice to soothe burned areas. Do not apply ointments or antiseptics. Cover with non-adhesive gauze and bandage loosely. Extent and placement of burn are crucial. Emergency hospital treatment is needed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • if 10% of an adult's body or 15% of a child's (one arm equals about 9% of total body surface) has been burned. • if the victim shows signs of shock (pale face; cold, clammy skin; sweaty forehead and palms; weak pulse; accelerated breathing or lack of consciousness). He should be kept flat and wrapped in a light blanket. • if the face or eyes are burned. Burns on joints also need immediate medical attention because scar tissue may develop that could inhibit movement. • if a whole finger or hand is burned, or the skin has been broken or swelling persists. Tetanus shots and antibiotics may be needed. <p>The affected area will not be painful immediately because nerve endings are damaged, but apply ice to surrounding skin. Do not apply cold water. (See second-degree burns.)</p>	<p>When cooking with grease, watch for signs of overheating or bubbling over. Keep broiler free of heavy grease buildup and other food drippings.</p> <p>Do not allow food to accumulate in the bottom of toasters or broilers. Stay in the kitchen when appliances are in use.</p> <p>Do not cook in flowing garments or with long hair loose.</p> <p>Use potholders to avoid direct contact with hot surfaces.</p> <p>Be especially careful with boiling water, hot oil or perking coffee. To avoid being scalded with hot steam, never open a pressure cooker prematurely. Turn handles of pots and skillets toward the back of stove so children cannot pull them down. Keep all cords out of the reach of youngsters. Set home water heaters at low temperatures to avoid scalding from hot tap water.</p> <p>Be especially careful near open flames when children are around.</p>

A basic emergency kit to be kept in a convenient place in the kitchen, but out of reach of children, should include: • small (2½ lbs.) dry-chemical fire extinguisher, known as an ABC; • fireproof blanket, available at hardware stores; • large bath towel; • small clean towels; • large box of bicarbonate of soda; • sterile cloth pads and bandages; • ipecac, a medicine to induce vomiting; • activated charcoal.

<p>Serious cuts or gashes</p> <p>Choking on food</p> <p>Poisons</p> <p>Electric shock</p> <p>Eye injuries</p>	<p>Using clean, dry towel or layers of gauze, apply pressure to the wound. If blood penetrates cloth, add more layers. Clotting may take three to ten minutes, so maintain pressure.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If possible, raise wound area above rest of body. • Do not apply tourniquet, which will stop flow of blood to too large an area. • If the wound is deep or wide, stitches, antibiotics and a tetanus shot may be necessary. • When a portion of a finger has been sliced off, pack it in ice and rush to the hospital. <p>If the victim is gagging or turning blue, perform the Heimlich Maneuver to dislodge food:</p> <p>Adults</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Put arms around victim's waist from behind. • Make fist with one hand and place thumb side against abdomen, just below rib cage. • Cup palm of other hand over fist and press into the abdomen with a short, upward thrust. Repeat, if necessary, until food pops out. <p>Children under four</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lay child on his back on a flat surface such as chair or table. • Use index and middle fingers of both hands to press against abdomen just below the rib cage with a short, upward thrust. <p>Yoursell</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grasp fist with cupped palm of other hand. Thrust upward into abdomen below rib cage. <p>Treatment for poisoning depends on the substance and the amount consumed. If one suspects a poison has been swallowed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify substance and the amount ingested. • Call local poison control center or hospital emergency room immediately for instructions. Do not treat without medical advice. Proceed to the hospital as soon as possible. <p>Induce Vomiting</p> <p>If non-caustic substance such as aspirin, barbiturates, tranquilizers or some arsenics has been ingested, objective is to remove substance from the body immediately.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use emetic such as ipecac syrup. Follow label instructions for dosage. • Do not wait for vomiting before rushing to hospital. <p>Do Not Induce Vomiting</p> <p>Caustic substances such as acid (in some drain or toilet-bowl cleaners), lyes (in some non-phosphate detergents, paint removers, cleaning agents) or oil-based distillates (turpentine, gasoline, kerosene, paint thinners) should be diluted in the stomach. Vomiting will only cause further internal damage to the throat and esophagus.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dilute poison by drinking copious amounts of milk or water. • Absorb poison by swallowing activated charcoal powder. Read directions for dosage. <p>Note: In all cases of vomiting, hold victim so that fumes will not be breathed into lungs.</p> <p>• Shut off power source, if possible. Otherwise, disengage victim from current using padded potholder mitts to protect yourself. While there may be little visible damage, internal injury may have occurred. Victim needs emergency treatment if dazed or in shock.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Keep him flat and wrapped with a light blanket. • Remove any mucus or foreign matter from throat and nose. <p>• In the event of contact with soap, detergents or chemicals, wash affected area with cold running water for up to 15 minutes. Cover with gauze and proceed to emergency room.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If a rough-edged particle gets in the eye, do not flush out. To avoid abrasions, keep the eyeball immobile by lightly pressing a sterile pad against the lid and rush to the hospital. 	<p>Keep cutting instruments well-sharpened; many accidents occur with dull knives. Pay attention when using a knife. Cut away from body and use cutting board. Do not leave knives loose in a drawer or dish rack, and keep all such utensils out of the reach of children.</p> <p>Especially for small children and adults with false teeth, cut food into bite-size pieces and discard any tiny bones before serving.</p> <p>Don't leave cleaners, detergents, medicines or other potentially dangerous substances where small children can get them. Use child-proof locks on all cabinets containing such products, and label bottles clearly. Use child-proof caps. Never transfer a potentially harmful substance into an unmarked or mislabeled jar that an adult might mistake for something innocuous.</p> <p>Make sure outlets are covered and no extension cord wires are exposed. Shoulder pain, as a symptom, is easily recognized but seldom understood.

Earlier, less acute symptoms provide the tip-off. What often results in the aching, throbbing shoulder is a condition that began as stiff and tender "shawl" muscles across the top of the shoulders.

Left untreated that stiffness and tenderness can progress over a period of weeks to ultimately reach an intensity that is almost unbearable. Burning ache of shoulder can and often does extend into the neck and head.

Obviously, neck and shoulder movement then becomes increasingly difficult and painful. The first serious interest in correction frequently follows the frustration a person has who attempts to shave or comb the hair or shampoo it, as that action can cause an increase in sharpness of pain down the arm and tingling in the fingers.

Ultimately weakness and fatigue, tremor of the arm accompanies the pain and the muscles across the chest may become tender. The symptoms then are all the more recognizable and made more severe by coughing or sneezing.

Ultimately, nature responds to the incessant pain with varying degrees of immobility.

Shoulder and arm pain constitutes the most frequently recognized symptom of structural defects in the lower neck and upper spine.
